



- Interviews guided by a questionnaire:
  - Strategic and Policy Framework
    - National legislation and strategies/strategic action plans
    - International standards and compliance
    - EC Chapter 12 (Food Safety, Veterinary and Phytosanitary Policy)
  - Technical Framework
    - Preparedness (non-emergency times)
      - Border protection
      - Prevention
      - Detection
    - Response (emergency times)
    - Recovery (post emergency times)

### All ADEWB project beneficiary countries:

- Took part in the interviews
- Demonstrated high level of cooperation with the ADEWB project

## **Key Conclusions:**

## ADEWB project beneficiary countries:

- Similar challenges significant potential for sharing experience and knowledge
- Institutional reforms and development and availability of relevant documentation
- Identified potentials and demonstrated high level of willingness for regional cooperation and collaboration in prevention and control of transboundary animal diseases and zoonoses
  - Recognised opportunities to explore possibilities for regional synergies, networks and expertise
  - Recognised potential for increasing visibility and credibility of veterinary services nationally, regionally and internationally

## Recommendations:

## ADEWB project beneficiary countries should:

- Continue with adoption of the principles of regional cooperation and communication as promoted by the best practice (i.e. OIE, EU EC and EFSA)
- Consider a regional ownership and approach to prevention and control of transboundary animal diseases and zoonoses by:
  - Establishing a joint Western Balkan Chief Veterinary Officers Regional Forum for Cooperation and Communication through:
    - Setting the principles for exchange of information
    - Defining key priority Strategic and Policy areas and Technical areas that meets actual needs and demands



#### Step 1:

Set up a WB CVOs Regional Forum

#### The ADEWB project beneficiary countries regional cooperation and communication (an example only)

#### **Proposed structure**

1. Strategic and Policy (high level decision-making) level

#### Prevention and control of transboundary animal diseases and zoonoses

- Chief Veterinary Officers:
  - Agree and establish an ADEWB project beneficiary countries
     Regional Forum for Cooperation and Communication,
  - Set regional priorities by considering potential areas related to Strategic and Policy Framework and Technical Framework (i.e. Preparedness, Response and Recovery),
  - Agree/initiate core implementation mechanisms,
  - Oversee and review implementation,
  - Oversee liaison with international initiatives (OIE, FAO) and funding donors (EU)

- Technical (operational) level
- Nominated Country Coordinators Technical Group:
  - Establish a joint coordination framework,
  - Coordination of an action plan with focus on identified key priority areas related to capability, capacity, resources and training and simulation, including implementation and reporting,
  - On-going review and proposing recommendations and updates.

The process	Prevention and control of transpoundary animal diseases and zoonoses
1. Determine the scope	<ul> <li>Identify past and ongoing regional activities and their key focus areas,</li> <li>Identify challenges,</li> </ul>
2. Agree main objectives	<ul> <li>Identify context for common objectives of interest for regional cooperation and communication related to prevention and control of transboundary animal diseases and zoonoses, and/or other areas as needed,</li> <li>Identify communication mechanisms and their implementation,</li> </ul>
3. Agree an action plan	<ul> <li>Define key priorities of interest and a timeline,</li> <li>Identify implementation options and mechanisms,</li> </ul>
4. Ensure implementation	Carry out implementation of an agreed action plan,
5. Monitor an action plan and assess the impact	<ul> <li>Hold the regional forum's virtual and in-person meetings,</li> <li>Review progress, timelines and whether the objectives, key priorities and implementation activities are still relevant,</li> </ul>
6. Review an action plan	Adjust action plan as required.

- Standardised Agenda and Meeting templates

## Process for establishing a WB CVOs Regional Forum for Cooperation and Communication

## Step 4:

**Management and Timelines** 

- > Rotating Chair invitation outlining:
  - A meeting date, time, and a venue (either virtual or physical),
  - A meeting Agenda outlining objectives and expected outputs.
- > Meeting Minutes outlining:
  - Agreed actions responsibilities, mechanisms and agreed timelines,
  - A next rotating Chair and Deputy Chair


